UCAS deadlines

I wanted to provide some clarification around the approaching UCAS deadline on Wednesday 31st January at 18:00pm for Year 13 students. This deadline is set by UCAS and is for all undergraduate applications to receive equal consideration.

We know that students are becoming increasingly worried about when their applications will be sent off, however, please rest assured that universities **do not** fill their spaces on a first come first serve basis. A snippet taken from the UCAS website states: "This is our 'equal consideration' deadline, which means course providers **must** consider all applications received by this time equally."

Once your son/daughters application has been approved, the next stage is for their tutor to compile their three subject references, add these to UCAS alongside their predicted grades and only then can a final check of the whole application can be completed before sending. We are all working hard to do this, but please do bear with us as we process a significant number of applications around our usual teaching and work schedules.

Please also note that we are working through these in order that students submitted to us (from those that met the initial 8th December internal deadline).

We will ensure that **all** student applications that have met our (extended) internal deadline of 19th January (today), at 3pm are sent off prior to the 31st January deadline. Separate communications have been sent directly to parents/guardians of students whose UCAS is still outstanding.

Safeguarding information – difficult conversations

We encourage all of our students to be open about things that are concerning them and things that become a worry. Especially as we move into the period of the academic year where students begin to feel more stress and anxiety, this becomes more important than ever.

At UTCR we use an open door policy, the Whisper Button, suggestion boxes and regular talks with our safeguarding team to encourage students to engage with us, even when the topic might feel difficult.

We are really keen to work together with our whole community to encourage this open dialogue to support our students and we are aware these conversations can sometimes be difficult.

GCSE Pod – Revision app and website for Year 10

We are pleased to share that your child now has access to GCSEPod's library of over 6,500 'Pods', 3-5 minute videos designed to deliver knowledge in short bursts. GCSEPod makes learning and revision much more manageable: every Pod is mapped to an exam board, and contains all the right facts, quotes, keywords, dates and annotated diagrams that your child needs for GCSE success – all neatly organised into topics and exam playlists.

One of the best things about GCSEPod is that it is so easy to access! You can download any Pod to your child's mobile device, and then they can watch them at any time, in any place, with or without internet. It's like they're carrying a whole set of textbooks in their pocket. Make sure you download the GCSEPod app from the App Store (Apple and Android are supported) to access this feature.

As well as Pods, GCSEPod also has a host of Student Learning Activities which are designed to help students commit content to their long-term memory. Alongside this is the award-winning Check & Challenge tool which provides quizzes for your child to test their knowledge and to track their progress throughout the academic year. Check & Challenge provides scaffolded support through hints, multiple choice options and feedback statements which helps to consolidate learning and build students' confidence.
