Thames Valley Police Safety Partnership

I would like to inform you that on Wednesday morning we hosted officers from Thames Valley Police and their safety arches as part of our joint safety partnership.

We know that the local context in Reading means we need to provide more in-depth education on knife crime and violent crime to our young people, and this visit today enables us to reassure our community that we are actively working with Thames Valley Police to provide this support and education.

As part of the event - all students in key stage 4 participated in a search of their belongings by UTC staff and then walked through the safety arches with the TVP officers' supervision.

I am really pleased to report no restricted items were found in the searches carried out today and I would like to thank all the students in Year 10 and 11 for their cooperation and professional behaviours during this event.

Over the coming weeks we will be replicating this event for our key stage 5 students and also engaging with other safety practices such as drugs safety dog visits.

I will keep you updated on these events as they happen and would like to thank you for your cooperation in supporting UTC Reading in being a safe place to study and work.

Celebration of professional qualifications

A huge number of students now hold professional qualifications across a range of areas. We have seen some excellent news in the last week with students scoring 978 out of 1000 in a Microsoft Powerpoint Professional Qualification.
