- Staff and students will be curious and have empathy and understanding towards each other
- · A high quality of education with a consistent workforce, and if not clear information as to why
- Staff and students will be punctual to lessons
- PSHE is delivered seriously and that content is relevant to the issues of today, students will put
 maximum personal effort into the lessons
- · Consequences are set for the individual not the group

We will do this by;

- Creating safe spaces for diverse groups
- Understanding and respecting students needs, students will respect all equipment and their environment
- Information sharing and improving communication between staff and students, that all staff and all students will read their emails and Teams messages
- · Creating strong relationships between students and staff
- · Raising the profile of the student board
- Talk to students about boundaries
- Training to staff to apply rules consistently
- High quality informative teaching that all students will invest in and demonstrate clear personal effort
- A clear safeguarding system of who to go to
- Transparent leadership
- Sticking to the rules and following instructions
